Stop Press - Councillors vote for more money for themselves

At the recent budget meeting which put up our Council Tax, Councillors also voted to pay themselves well over £1 million in allowances. This is a 7 per cent rise. They even had the cheek to backdate the rise to last year as well! Your local Labour councillors get at least £30,000 and have voted for another £2,000. This at a time when the Council have cut £100 million from our services. This is disgraceful!

Keep our 15 minutes free parking

In a rush to do a U turn on the scrapping of the 15 minute free parking in our High Streets, the Council has come up with a ludicrous scheme. There will be 5 minutes free parking with a 10 minute grace period before people get fined! Residents and businesses have said that the 5 minute parking will confuse people and will not encourage them to stop and shop. They are asking people to sign a petition to keep the 15 minute free parking.

Focus says: To change every sign in the borough from 15 minutes to 5 minutes is daft and will cost a fortune.
